## **Sexuality**

### God's Plan in Exclusivity

## The importance of exclusivity.

1. Sex is God's way of saying, "I belong **completely** and **exclusively** to you.

Genesis 2:24 (NIV)

<sup>24</sup> For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh.

Ephesians 5:31 (NIV)

<sup>31</sup>"For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."

 Sex is the powerful <u>statement</u> that <u>two</u> have come together <u>emotionally</u>, <u>spiritually</u>, intellectually, financially, physically, and in every other way.

Mark 10:8 (NIV)

<sup>8</sup> and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one.

3. A <u>whole body</u> commitment is designed to go along with a <u>whole</u> **life** commitment.

Ephesians 5:25 (NIV)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>25</sup> Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her.

- 4. Sexual love is **dehumanizing** if it is not in an **exclusive** relationship.
- 5. It is a horrible thing to be physically vulnerable with someone both not be personal, socially, economically, emotionally, spiritually vulnerable.

#### 1 Corinthians 6:16 (NIV)

- <sup>16</sup>Do you not know that he who unites himself with a prostitute is one with her in body? For it is said, "The two will become one flesh."
  - 6. To say, "I will give you my body, but <u>not</u> my independence, money, <u>heart</u>, or life," is a <u>cruel</u>, selfish, inconsiderate statement.

# The power of exclusivity.

7. God's plan for sex is that you give yourself away so **personally**, and so **deeply** that the result is a personal **transformation**.

### **Ephesians 5:25-30 (NIV)**

<sup>25</sup> Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her

<sup>26</sup> to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless.

<sup>28</sup> In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.

<sup>29</sup> After all, no one ever hated his own body, but he feeds and cares for it, just as Christ does the church--

<sup>30</sup> for we are members of his body.

8. **Everyone** needs a **word** from outside of ourselves to tell us we are **wonderful**, and sex has the power to make that statement.

### John 15:12 (NIV)

- <sup>12</sup> My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.
  - 9. Sex improperly used will <u>undermine</u> your <u>sanctification</u>, but sex used <u>properly</u> brings sanctification.

### 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8 (NIV)

<sup>3</sup> It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality;

<sup>4</sup> that each of you should learn to control his own body in a way that is holy and honorable,

<sup>5</sup> not in passionate lust like the heathen, who do not know God;

- a. If the world doesn't think you are **beautiful**, your lover has the **power** to tell them they are **wrong**.
- b. If you have been <u>hurt</u> in the past, your lover has the power to <u>heal</u> your heart.
- c. If you have suffered <u>neglect</u>, your lover has the sanctifying power to <u>mend</u> the suffering.
- d. If you don't feel **good** about yourself, your lover has the sanctifying power to **affirm** you.
